We are a community owned Greengrocer, established in 2013 as a Community Benefit Society for the benefit of the community. We exist for the benefit of the community and not for a profit. Our mission is to sell wholesome, local fruit, vegetables and wholefoods to the community – who are our shareholders – we have some Our community shareholders are in Edinburgh, many in our local area: our purpose is to serve the community.

Our project, led Dig-In Bruntsfield and hosted by the Eric Liddell Centre (ELC) will use the funding to develop, promote and deliver a series of free, community climate-focused events. It will culminate with a Community Climate Fair (CCF) and establishment of a Community Climate Action Hub (CCAH).

The project aims to show the importance fostering the 'mycelium network' within existing place-based community organisations working in climate. Creating a Hub – with physical collaborative events but also branding and virtual connection - can help increase engagement and empower communities to take place-based climate action and to help deliver Edinburgh's climate goals.

Our project leverages knowledge and existing activities of local community organisations. It responds to community research by ELC which highlights that the local community want more activities associated with wellbeing and health, local events and sustainability.

Climate-smart meals create healthier, more resilient communities with lower consumption related greenhouse gas emissions. Building on the success of Dig-In's regular tasting and recipe events, the project will host 3 themed 'CCAH: Climate Smart Food' workshops. Healthy, plant based recipes and skills will be shared – in collaboration with guidance from local nutritionists and with the local food community: Rhyze Mushrooms – who grow edible mushrooms through circular economy in urban waste streams and Edinburgh Fermentarium who make and teach healthy, plant based recipes.

With inspiration from the Planetary Health Diet, recipes will be developed for use in the workshops and for wider sharing in Edinburgh through project team networks – with nutrition, climate and cost of living benefits highlighted. Workshop participants will learn to make the recipes, also sharing skills and knowledge - making food last longer, reducing food waste, how to shorten local supply chains and eat more seasonally and why climate smart can also be nutritious and cost effective. We will work with Media Education to create a short film to share – *CCAH*: *Climate Smart Eats*.

More time in nature improves wellbeing. Greener cities provide cooler, more resilient communities for the future. The project will undertake seasonal meadows and tree planting with local organisation Friends of the Meadows and Bruntsfield Links (FoMBL). It will expand the existing wildflower meadow on the Bruntsfield Links (already supported by ECC) though a 'CCAH Nature: Planting Pollinators' event which will engage the local community in nature based climate action. A project to co-create signage for the meadow will be run with schools – highlighting links between food systems, nature and climate action.

The project will culminate in a Community Climate Fair –the first in Edinburgh – collaborating with Bruntsfield Area Net Zero Action Initiative (BANZAI) who, in addition to nature and food, have local community circles focused on transport, home energy and activism. The fair will launch the Community Climate Hub and will showcase the project work, bringing together project partners and wider organisations (e.g. Edible Edinburgh, Edinburgh Climate Forum), local suppliers and makers as well as inspiring speakers and ECC guests.

The project measures of success will include attendance, dissemination and number of 'community climate pledges' made by participants.
