Since 2019, FEH has held thirteen free in-person and online events to a total of 181 participants, on home energy saving, renewables and a range sustainability-related topics including climate activism. We use guest speakers, drawing on the wealth of expertise in Edinburgh. FEH is a working group of Transition Edinburgh (https://transitionedinburgh.org.uk/), which connects and supports community groups, and initiates practical projects that strive for a greener, fairer, healthier and more resilient Edinburgh since 2009. TE is a Local Network of the Transition Scotland Hub of the Global Transition Network. We would use the money to deliver Fairmilehead Futures, a nine-month community programme for local residents, building on Fairmilehead Energy Hub's three year track record of delivering low carbon information sessions in partnership with a range of experts.

Fairmilehead Futures will have the following aims:

- To offer local residents good-quality advice to how to take practical steps towards low carbon, sustainable living.
- To bring together local residents who are interested in sustainable living and climate action, with the aim of building connections and creating a local network.
- To increase interest, opportunities and engagement in low carbon action locally.
- To actively encourage and gather ideas to seed local action beyond the end date of the project.
- To engage with a wide range of local organisations and businesses in the promotion and delivery of the programme.
- To draw on the wealth of expertise in low carbon / sustainability in Edinburgh by inviting relevant organisations and businesses to help us co-deliver sessions.

Fairmilehead Futures will include

- Advice sessions: Nine inspiring monthly advice sessions with a practical focus, on topics such as
 energy saving, solar panels, EVs, heat pumps and 'grow your own'. These will be co-delivered by
 guest presenters. This strand is an expansion of the previous events run by FEH, but with greater
 opportunity to promote the programme locally and engage more residents.
- **Repair café sessions:** Six repair café events drawing on the skills of various repair organisations across Edinburgh, including IT, sewing and furniture.
- Opening social/family event: To bring together local residents and look to the year ahead, also giving the opportunity to let us know what topics would be useful for the final two advice sessions.
- 'To the future' Closing event: To reflect back on the project, lessons learned and future actions, both personal and as a community.
- **Cycling event:** Our 2022 cycling event, including group cycle starting and ending at Fairmilehead Park, was a success and we will repeat this as part of Fairmilehead Futures.

Most events will be free; a small charge will be made for the repair café sessions. We will focus on future actions, both personal (we will invite participants to let us know practical changes/steps they are making) and community (we will actively work with participants to see what future community action is possible beyond the project).

A very important part of the project is to reach out to as many local residents, organisations and businesses as possible. To date, a lack of funding has limited FEH's attempts to engage with residents, impacting on how many residents it can inform about future opportunities. This funding would allow us to change this both for this project and the future, and we would put it towards:

- Half-day of professional marketing strategy support.
- The design and build of a dedicated FEH website, that could be used beyond the funding period.
- Leaflet drop to all households in Buckstone, Caiystane, Frogston, Swanston and Winton

FEH is an informal group that is part of constituted group Transition Edinburgh. Funding will be held in the TE bank account. The planning, delivery and reporting for Fairmilehead Futures will be carried out by FEH but TE will provide additional oversight and promotion. The outcomes of the project would feed into the learnings of the TE network.

The nature of the project is to draw on relevant expertise from out with the group. Previous FEH events have included experts from Home Energy Scotland, Energy Saving Trust, Changeworks, Edinburgh Solar Co-operative, Pawprint, Jorra, On Site Generation, Solar Kingdom, Spokes, The Bike Centre Edinburgh and Insulation Solutions, plus Ian Murray MP. We have a forthcoming session in March with Repair Café Edinburgh. For the Fairmilehead Futures advice sessions we will programme a mix of previous and new speakers, leaving room in the programme for topics/experts that residents would like included. Repair café sessions will include organisations such as Edinburgh Remakery, Repair Café Edinburgh, Remode Collective. Advice session speakers will generally be able to give their time on behalf of their organisation for expenses only, while repair café workshops will be booked for a fee.

We will work hard to engage with local organisations including Fairmilehead Parish Church, Buckstone and Pentland Primary School, Scottish Water (based at Buckstone Terrace), local social media groups and businesses, with the aim that they will promote the programme to their network.

Green Buckstone (https://greenbuckstone.wordpress.com) is a local community recycling programme which will promote all events via its Facebook page (791 followers).

Buckstone-based Belter Marketing will be engaged to help with marketing strategy (www.beltermarketing.com), while Tide (www.tide-scotland.co.uk) will provide design support on an in-kind basis.
