Briefly describe your project aims (please refer to your original application and also note any later changes/developments to the project):

This fund enabled us to pay our Volunteer Coordinator full time to manage and grow our food sharing project. This is an essential role in our project and without this position we would not be able to successfully continue this important work.

We have almost 50 active volunteers who take our bikes out every weekday evening to collect up to 300kg of food every time. This food is saved from landfill and redistributed to people who need it most.

By collecting surplus food from supermarkets, we prevent these products from being wasted, which helps people and planet. We ensure these tasty items end up on plates - where they should be - and limit the greenhouse gas emissions associated with food 'waste'. Typically, 1 tonne of food wasted from supermarkets results in 1 kg CO2 equivalent emissions*. These greenhouse gas emissions can negatively alter our atmosphere and impact climate change. Working through existing charities and services, we get food to those that need it in a dignified way.

Over 80,000 people in Edinburgh live in poverty, affecting almost 1 in 5 children**. Ideally, the service we and our partners deliver shouldn't be needed, but sadly it is and we are proud to be able to offer the support that we do. This fund would be an invaluable contribution in making our food sharing project more sustainable, successful and far reaching.

We supported over 50 volunteers to work together with partners to deliver this community project of food collection. This activity encouraged leadership from individuals to make a difference to their local community by leading by example. They used carbon saving transport to save food from landfill therefore releasing further carbon emissions. Within our volunteers there are those who take the lead on evening collections when we have 5 or more volunteers active with no member of staff present. Our volunteers have also supported at events and on our Board of Trustees further creating opportunities for community leadership.

Our activities at events and with community partners created opportunities for climate learning. By attending events and running training sessions we shared information on reducing carbon footprint by choosing Active Travel. We have engaged with 2000+ people on our social media platforms by offering more learning by sharing information about climate change.

We continued to train and recruit volunteers for our evening collections of surplus food. This project year we collected and redistributed 46 tonnes of food. Our volunteers used eCargo Bikes to do this, reducing the carbon footprint of this activity substantially-previously this work was completed by diesel van. By training people to ride our bikes we equip them with skills to use our bikes at other times within their communities and support us at events. We do not use any carbon emitting vehicles for any of our work.

We saved 11 tonnes of food waste saving 28 tonnes of carbon emissions if this food was to end up in landfill.

We replaced 8,902 miles of car/ van journeys with eCargo Bikes saving 2.20 tonnes of C02 emissions.

We attended 23 events and engaged with over 8,000 people. We trained 65 people to ride eCargo Bikes and completed 1,507 days of eCargo Bike loans within our community. We worked with 12 community groups, charities and organisations.

Our project brought a host of changes and benefits to our community: free access to food, reduced carbon emissions in the city centre and at landfill sites, supported people to choose Active Travel for themselves and their families, increased confidence riding bicycles, empowered



communities to establish shared assets for local people, supported partner organisations to use carbon saving vehicles and hosted several organisations at our central hub location.

LESSONS LEARNED

What worked well and what could have been improved?

We work well as a small team with limited capacity. Our volunteers are passionate and incredibly capable people who are very generous with their time. Through this teamwork we achieved a lot across our activities. The impact of this work can be demonstrated in the increase in activity for Project Year 2024/25 where we have delivered more food collections, events, eCargo Bike Loans and partnership working.

However, there is room for improvement in our delivery. A more focussed approach with dedicated funding would help us dig deeper into issues- this is especially true of the food collection. This is an activity which is carried out by other organisations using vans- we would like to change this. We could offer training and equipment to existing organisations or utilise our large network of volunteers to make collections. At the moment we do not have the resources (staff time, eCargo Bikes) to make this happen. We are slowly supporting other organisations to make the change to eCargo Bikes for their collections but without dedicated funding this is slow progress.
