Our project implements the three Rs of reducing, re-using and recycling which play such a key role in reducing the energy and resources taken to make products, reducing emissions and sustaining the environment. In 23-24 we diverted 60.5 tons of goods from landfill through the starter packs. extending the life of everyday household goods and reducing the emissions required to produce new.

More specifically our contribution towards a net zero transition include:

- We pick-up, assess, PAT test and deliver used white goods as part of our service to support people moving on from temporary accommodation. We can also provide donated white goods to people who are unable to afford replacements, picking up the broken appliances ensuring adequate recycling and avoiding fly tipping in the local area.
- Green working alternatives: electric vans / we are paperless / flexible homeworking is encouraged.
- Small donated electrical items are PAT tested and redistributed through our starter packs or other local charity shops.
- Donations of broken good are sold as scrap metal. The same principle is applied to donations of fabric and clothing of too poor quality to be donated.
- We negotiate partnerships with local food producers and supermarkets to avoid food and seasonal goods being thrown out instead we accept their unwanted stocks which are donated through our starter packs, Pantry and shop, or passed on to other charity shops.
- We have partnerships with several local Universities, Student accommodation providers and Hotels we accept their donations of laundered duvets, blankets, bedding, crockery, utensils, toiletries, and towels; all stocks which would otherwise go to landfill.

A further 14.8 Tons (goods which are not in a good enough conditions) have been diverted through scrap metal and others recycling service.

**Number of charities/groups engaged in the project, etc.** Beneficiaries: Individuals and families who lack the financial and social resources to settle easily in new unfurnished properties following homelessness and people living with the isolation, stress and stigma that accompany extreme poverty - their choice is going without or getting into debt. **Over 23-23 we delivered a total of 17,964 starter packs helping 3,492 households**.

What did people feel was the most important or valuable aspect of your project?

We requested funding to help us run **the Starter Packs service** – it helped us increase the amount of goods we can store, organise in packs and distribute to people moving on from homelessness. This is an essentials ask as the number of families facing extreme hardship is increasing across Edinburgh. Being able to make a home is a crucial step towards supporting tenants to cope with the trauma of their 'homeless' experience, reduce stress and anxiety and improve mental health and well-being. The Starter Packs provide service users with the essential goods they need to set up their home, reducing the stress and financial burden involved in the transition from homelessness to being rehoused. Our service-users typically have been living for long periods in temporary accommodation, have lost all their possessions and been allocated unfurnished properties which are often poorly decorated. They do not have the means to purchase household goods nor the skills or support networks to make improvements. Without our help, their options are to either go without or go into debts!

## A real life story

When J. split from her partner, she realised she was not on the tenancy agreement. When it came to moving out, she couldn't afford the rent by herself. J. had to live in a B&B for 2 years before getting an affordable tenancy. "I'd never had to deal with anything like that before. It's hard because you are confined to one room. For the first 11 months I didn't even have access to a washing machine or cooking facilities. It was lonely, isolating and restricted; sometimes you would just crack up." J. was referred to Fresh Start "I was excited and filled with adrenaline the day I got my keys but it's daunting, you are just left to it. All I had to move in was my clothes and a chair. It was great to get the help from Fresh Start, they provided all the basics I needed and helped me obtained furniture and white goods too and even helped with repainting some of the rooms. I feel content in my new home."

#### **LESSONS LEARNED**

## What worked well and what could have been improved?

- Not so much what work well or could be improved but more a reflexion on challenges faced: Seeing the rise in needs increase so drastically over the past year. It puts a lot of pressure on service provision, staff morale and resources 2023 has very much been another crisis year.
- The lack of long-term funding is another difficulty; it makes it difficult to plan and develop medium to long term projects to bring real change.
- The lack of larger funds adds to the difficulty described above and means that charities spend a lot of staff resources on raising funds from other sources, on administering numerous smaller funds and on finding alternative ways to stock our warehouse/shop and Pantry.
- While all these factors ensure we remain resilient, adaptable, and as efficient as possible, it also means a lot of energy and resources is diverted from helping people.

Luckily, Fresh Start and partner organisations have built strong partnerships and bonds over the years; we all share knowledge, skills, resources as much as possible and opportunities; without these strong relationships it would be difficult to achieve a much as we do. We also have a great staff team whose dedication,



commitment and continuous efforts is key to our continued success. Finally, while long term funding is helpful so are larger one-year grant as they can provide substantial match funding to put against other bids.
